CORONA VIRUS AND MASKS

On Tuesday we received new guidance from Welsh Government on the use of facemasks in schools.

CARE INSPECTORATE WALES

As previously mentioned we are now registered with the CIW. This will enable parents to apply for benefits, which will significantly help reduce the cost of childcare. From the start of next term afterschool club will be open to 5:30pm. More information on benefits and how to apply for them will be communicated to everyone in the near future.
