We have been really enjoying our latest unit of maths on volume and capacity. We have been outside predicting and testing out which out of two different objects weigh more.




In this latest half term, we have been practising and improving our tennis skills. The class have done amazingly well and there are definitely some talented players in our class!


Easter disco
