



The class have been loving athletics afternoons during May. They are all super excited to show everyone how fast they are in our upcoming sports day.





Mrs Drew's Class




Year 3/4 have had another busy half-term. They have been:


The children who did not go on the residential trip enjoyed spending time with Mrs Drew, Miss Akbas and Miss Poole.
