In Cymraeg, we have been learning about different foods. We did a fun taste test where the children had to guess what food or drink they were eating, answering in Welsh.



We have started a new topic in Maths this month. We have been learning about how to record data in different ways. These include tally charts and block diagrams. The children have been loving this topic!










# Year 3/4
